Notes of Environment Group meeting held on Tuesday 15th August 2023

1. Charmouth in Bloom review: the team had enjoyed meeting the judges and felt that the tour went well. The school responded especially positively. It was pleasing that the library and Anchor Housing residents were being recognized with 'It's our neighbourhood' certificates. While the village looked well cared for at the time, thanks to those around the table and three others, more volunteers to assist with the preparation would have been welcomed.

Jane spoke about Wootton's 'spruce up' activities which were well supported, with cake, and mobilized through a WhatsApp group.

2. Planting plans:

Planting of hedging around two sides of the bowling green had been agreed: the measurements were to be checked to ensure enough plants were available on Saturday 21st October from 10am (with the following Saturday held in reserve and possibly for extending the hedging at West Green).

Maintenance: tidying around the trees in the Queens Green Canopy and community orchard was to be undertaken on Wednesday 6th September during 4-6pm using grass clippings as a mulch.

Bulbs: it was agreed to spend the remainder of the Charmouth in Bloom budget on spring bulbs. Jane was to check whether we could source the bulbs from Bloms and/or Millers.

3. Information and awareness:

Plaques: some rationalization of the signs at the foreshore had been undertaken. Sally King from Dorset had offered to assist with design of the information plaques in the autumn.

Shoreline: for the December edition, Julie was to provide an article on bonfires while there also could be updates on Britain in Bloom, hedge planting and the web site articles.

Web site: Julie was to provide her report on butterflies and moths and the Dorset COP activity.

Heat mapping: Andrew to ask Belinda about the energy champions' plans.

Saturday get togethers: it was agreed to trial the informal get togethers in the Bank House Café on Saturdays 7th October, 4th November and 2nd December from 10-12 noon. The hope was to attract more people interested in the environment through exchange of ideas which could be subsequently reviewed by this Group.

Training sessions: the possibility of offering some training sessions on horticulture was to be explored with the Gardening Club.

Carbon footprints: Andrew was to ask Cllr Belinda Bawden about possible help from Dorset Council.

- 4. **River Char projects**: Julie reported that Wessex Water were bringing forward by 3-4 years plans to improve the Newlands treatment plant. She was seeking approval from the Council's Foreshore Committee for a clean up of nurdles on the beach in the winter.
